1. Introduction

BMX Norway and the city of Sandnes are thrilled to extend a warm welcome to all participants of the Nordic BMX Championship 2024. With a rich legacy of hosting major events dating back to the BMX World Championship in 1991, BMX Norway is no stranger to the spotlight. Latest endeavors include the successful hosting of the UCI Supercross series at Randaberg Arena and the UEC European Cup at Velde Arena.

This year, we are excited to extend an invitation to Velde Arena, situated just outside the town of Sandnes. Constructed in 2013, Velde Arena has swiftly earned a reputation as one of Scandinavia's most formidable tracks for both BMX and Supercross disciplines.

2. Velde Arena Sviland BMX

The Velde Arena track comprises two starting hills and three double straights. The Supercross track features an impressive 8-meter hill and includes a prosection along with a rhythm section. The 5-meter hill provides a steep and challenging experience akin to an SX start, albeit slightly lower. Renowned for its excellent flow and expansive open turns, the track offers optimal conditions for exhilarating racing experiences. Approximately 80% of the track surface is covered in concrete bricks, ensuring exceptionally fast speeds. Moreover, the Velde Arena boasts a grandstand capable of accommodating up to 1000 spectators, providing ample seating for avid fans to enjoy the thrilling BMX action.

REGISTRATION AND RIDER'S CONFIRMATION

Registration procedure

Sign up via EQ Timing, Payment by Credit card.

Deadline August 5th (23:59 CET)

In the registration form, all non-Norwegian riders aged 11 and older are required to provide a valid UCI ID, Mylaps Transponder ID, and Numberplate (UCI Code, Mylaps-Prochip, and BMX Startnummer, respectively, in the form). For riders aged 10 and under, only the Numberplate is required.

Deadline cancellations

Cancelation is not possible after registration.



Rider confirmation

All team managers must attend the rider confirmation on Friday at the Welcome center to confirm their rider's participation for the event and receive accreditations.

Late entries

Federations, clubs can register riders as late entries till Monday, August 12th (23:59 CET) paying double entry fee for these riders.

Registration fees

The entry fees for all riders must be paid by federations or clubs in full to the organizers bank account before the deadline set for the event. Deadline for payment is Wednesday (August 7th).

The 2024 registration fees are the following:

7. Rules

The provisions of the latest version of the UCI's BMX Rulebook apply with a few amendments: Riders' categories: as set above.

Event format: For all categories' scrambled seeding is used for the motos according to article 6.1.027quater of the UCI BMX Rulebook. A and B finals in all challenge classes with finals rounds (9 or more riders confirmed).

The posting of race information including start lists and results will be done electronically at event. We will use <u>https://our.sqorz.com</u> for all race info.

Rider's equipment:

A rider must use number plate and side plate. A rider who fails to display the correct number plates will be refused their start, or relegated, if it is noticed after beginning a heat or run.



All Championship and Challenge riders must either wear a clearly visible national flag of their country on both shoulders or the national jersey of their country. National champions can use National champion jersey.

If a Championship rider is National Champion in their class, this rider must wear either:

- The jersey awarded by the federation,
- A replica of that jersey with publicity in the spaces allowed by the regulations,
- Their normal jersey with the left sleeve designed to look like the flag of their country

Number of motos: in case of special conditions (weather, wind or else) or a high number of participants, the Nordic BMX Commission allows the PCP in agreement with the National Technical delegate to reduce the number of motos. This can only apply for challenge classes and never for championship classes.

8. Numberplates, Sideplates and Transponders

All participants must bring their own number plate/side plate and transponder as these will <u>not</u> be provided by the organizers. It is imperative to ensure accurate personal details are provided during registration process.

For all riders aged 11 and above, across all categories. The use of a transponder and side plate is mandatory due to photofinish and timekeeping requirements. The designated transponder is the Mylaps Prochip <u>www.mylaps.com</u>. Riders are responsible for ensuring their transponder is functional and has an active subscription, as transponders will <u>not</u> be available for rent.

Riders aged 11 years and above must physically check their transponders at the Registration Station located at the track during official practice on Friday or, at the latest, during Saturday practice.

The participation is mandatory for: max. 1 National Delegate (Team manager). If necessary, the National Technical delegate and PCP can decide to call for other meetings during the event.

Each Country must appoint a Team Manager to confirm the participation of all riders, be present at the Team Manager meetings. The Team Manager must present his/her license provided by the federation.
